Whether planning to explore bustling markets with a hot toddy in hand or a blustery Boxing Day walk along the coast, visitors can find the perfect escape across every part of England's beautifully varied coastline.

## East Yorkshire is a Snow-stopper!

The seaside town of Bridlington is all set to sparkle on Saturday 16 November with a brand-new free event – the <u>Bridlington Ice Trail</u>. From 10.30 to 5.30pm, *Christmas on the Coast* will feature a series of stunning ice sculptures, forming a magical trail through the heart of this Victorian coastal town. Discover interactive displays and live ice carving depicting Christmas scenes and maritime wonders, lit up as a dazzling display at night.

Pick up an ice trail map and have fun exploring Bridlington's picturesque old town, don't miss the grand finale at 5.30pm - the Brid Christmas Lights Switch-on! Better still, turn it into a weekend and visit Bridlington's two-day Christmas Food Festival, tuck into artisan produce, street food, real ales and presents galore across more than 50 stalls, not forgetting a visit to Santa in his Grotto.

#### **Dreaming of a Wight Christmas**

The UK's first public floating sauna is now open at Tapnell Farm on the <u>Isle of Wight</u>. Bringing a Scandi-inspired wellness experience to the island. The Slomo Winter Warmer contrast therapy hub features two Nordic saunas with lake views, a seven-foot ice plunge tank for six people and a hygge-inspired lounging area with fire pit. Slomo Sauna sessions start at £15 per person.

Check out the winter markets for last-minute presents at the Donkey Sanctuary, Briddlesford Lodge arm and Wildheart Animal Sanctuary as well as the pop-up shop at the Garlic Farm.

#### Santa swaps North Pole for Seaham: Ho-Ho-Holidays on the Durham Heritage Coast

Guests looking for breath-taking winter seascapes, head to the Durham Heritage Coast, stroll the dramatic clifftops and warm up with a luxury hot chocolate at the harbour town of Seaham. Visit 14-15 December for the Victorian themed <u>Step Back into Christmas</u> <u>experience</u>. Guests can immerse themselves in this memory-making Victorian wonderland, create festive take-home treats, greet Father Christmas himself, and end the day with the

seasonal production that tops them all, A Christmas Carol. It's a day out so merry that even Scrooge would crack a smile.

## Celebrate in Skegness

'Tis the season to be jolly and nowhere celebrates the season like Skegness! Head to this fun-loving Lincolnshire town for the <u>Skegness Christmas Market</u> on Saturday 23 November from 10am to 6pm. There'll be plenty of warming drinks and scores of local craft and artisan stalls to pick up extra special gifts while enjoying free live entertainment throughout the day.

If holidaymakers want to burn off the mince pies, join the five-kilometre Santa Fun Run on Sunday 8 December from 10.30am to 1pm. Run, walk or crawl along Skegness seafront, it'll be raising money for the RNLI and other charities.

## Jingle all the way to Essex

Starting Saturday 30 November, visit Southend-on-Sea for Christmasville at Wonderland Adventure Inside. An enchanting Christmas village where kids can meet the red-suited man himself and receive a special toy. Each child's £15 ticket includes a free admission for an adult.

Vouchers for free activities like Adventure Golf, Sealife Adventure and arcade games are up for grabs[CH1] as well as access to all rides including The Polar Express Christmas Sleigh ride. There's free hot chocolate or berry juice, free mulled wine for parents and festive fun letter writing, reindeer food and special appearances by the Grinch, Mother Christmas and elves.
